Military Sealift Command (MSC) Training Courses

The Maritime Institute of Technology & Graduate Studies (MITAGS) offers courses that are certified by the Military Sealift Command (MSC). These programs have been specifically developed to satisfy the training requirements for contract mariners aboard LMSR (Large, Medium Speed, Roll-On/Roll-Off) vessels and others, which are critical components of the United States strategic sealift capability.

These courses are run at the MITAGS Campus.

**Chemical, Biological, and
Radiological
Defense Training Orientation
(MSC-CBRD-1)**

Duration: 1-day

April 2, 2010

May 21, 2010

August 13, 2010

October 8, 2010

This one-day course of instruction, certified as meeting Military Sealift Command (MSC) requirements, is designed to inform personnel of the hazards that are associated with weapons of mass destruction. Students will learn how to best protect themselves and their ship from these hazards and what their own or shared responsibilities are in a Chemical, Biological, and/or Radiological (CBR) environment.

Damage Control (MSC-DC)

Duration: 2-days

*(These classes run in the evening after
the Small Arms Class)*

This two-day course is composed of a classroom phase, followed by a practical application phase. The classroom sessions cover damage control investigation, communications, shoring, pipe patching, bulkhead plugging, and de-watering. The information learned during the classroom sessions is then reinforced in the application phase. During the application phase, attendees learn to perform as members of a damage control team to combat various types of shipboard damage, other than fire. The MITAGS course has been certified by the Military Sealift Command (MSC) as meeting MSC damage control standards and content requirements. Attendees should bring clothing appropriate

for working in a dirty, wet environment.

Small Arms Training (MSC-SMA)

Duration: 4-days

March 29 – April 1, 2010

May 17 – 20, 2010

August 9 – 12, 2010

October 4 – 7, 2010

This four-day program is specifically designed to provide mariners, who are destined for service on Department of Defense (DOD) contracted vessels, with the skills and knowledge necessary for safe and efficient gun handling techniques. Proper mindset and the use of “deadly force” is also examined and discussed in depth. Attendees in this program are given the opportunity to qualify with live fire on three weapons; the pistol, rifle, and shotgun. Two days are spent on an outdoor range, so attendees should bring appropriate seasonal clothing and rain gear.
